Holland High Tech is an independent foundation (Stichting TKI HTSM) that is funded by the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Climate Policy. Its structure includes a Board (Bestuur), a Supervisory Council (Raad van Toezicht), a Roadmap Council, an Executive Director (Directeur) and an Office (Bureau). The Board is responsible for the foundation's strategy and its execution. The Roadmap Council advises the Board in R&D programming for the Top Sector; the Supervisory Council provides the Board with strategic advice. The Director and the Office manage the day-to-day operation.
